

 Various routes, important water falls, water holes, sight seeing places and resting places

Sapling plantation

- o Choosing of plants by the visitor
- o Planting a sapling for a visitor
- o Watering and protection methodologies

FLORA AND FAUNA OF SIRUMALAI HILLS

Sirumalai plant species

- Identification of various herbs and shrubs in the Sirumalai region
- Usage and collection methodologies of herbs by the tribal community
- o Various forms of traditional healing systems

Sirumalai wild life animal species

- o Animal tracking system
- o Foot prints
- o Animal food habits
- o Animal usual paths

Sirumalai wild life birds species

- o Hornbill, eagle and owls
- o Honey sparrow, Paradise fly catcher and weaver bird

Important places of Sirumalai hills

- o Water holes and water falls
- o Big trees and important places
- o Sightseeing places (lord Meenatchi Amman Temple and Sathayar Dam)







Usage of Bio Degradable Materials during Trekking

- o Non usages of plastics and polypropylene
- o Avoiding usages of any carry bags
- o Throwing of used batteries, used biscuits and chocolate covers

Banning of Tobacco, Alcohol, other Flammable Materials during Trekking

- Non usage of tobacco and alcohol during trekking
- o Throwing of used alcohol bottles and cigarettes boxes
- Either a guide or a trekker should not litter fire during trekking

Maintaining Tool Kit / First Aid Kit

- o Usage of torch, knife and sickle
- o Usage of camera / binocular / night vision spectacles
- o Maintaining and changing of expiry medicines
- o Usage of medical first aid kits
- o Maintaining potable water / food items
- Importance of traditional rural food (foods prepared by minor millets)
